









Eco-Committee Interview Questions

Whilst it is not part of the Eco-Schools Criteria, we recommend you hold a democratic election to select your schools Eco-Committee members. As part of this process, you may want to interview the pupils who wish to join the Eco-Committee. Below is a series of suggested (but not mandatory) questions. In addition to these questions, we would recommend that children in your school are given the opportunity to ask the candidates their own questions.

- 1. Why do you want to become an Eco-Committee member?
- 2. How would our school benefit from having you on its Eco-Committee?
- **3.** What skills do you have that make you a suitable candidate for the role of Eco-Committee member?
- **4.** Which of the ten Eco-Schools topics is most important to you and why?

(Biodiversity, Energy, Global Citizenship, Healthy Living, Litter, Marine, School Grounds, Transport, Waste, Water)

- 5. If you are elected, what is the first thing you will do as an Eco-Committee member?
- 6. How do you plan to make sure the whole school knows about the work the Eco-Committee is doing?
- 7. How are you going to make sure the whole school is involved in our eco-work?
- 8. If you were an animal which one would you be and why?!
