Maths

We will start this term by learning about place value, followed by addition and subtraction, and finishing with multiplication and division.

Alongside this, we will be learning and practising our times tables and key instant recall facts.

History and Geography During the first half of this term, we will be studying the Mayan Civilisation-based on the enquiry question: Why should we remember the Maya? Next half term, we will study of the Alpine Region in Geography; focussing on the question 'Where should we go on holiday?'

Science

We will be learning about 'Earth and Space', Our second topic of the term will be Electricity.

English

This half term, we will be writing an information page on mysterious creatures; basing our writing on the book 'Mysteries of the Universe' by Colin Wilson. We shall also be using metaphors and similes to create a senses poem linked to our harvest service.

Next half term, we will focus on writing diaries linked to our History topic on the Mayans, followed by retelling stories based on Macbeth. We shall finish the term writing a story linked to the Christmas Story.

RE We shall begin the term by focussing on Christianity; answering the question 'How do Christians show their belief that Jesus is God incarnate.'

During the second half term we shall focus on Islam; answering the question 'How does tawhid create a sense of belonging to the Muslim community?'







Home Learning

Knowledge Organisers and Key Instant Recall Facts (KIRFs) are on our class page on the school website. Please support your child to engage with these as it will support their learning during lessons.

Reading is a real priority, both in school <u>and</u> at home. Children should read at home a minimum of 5 times a week. Answering questions and talking about the book is as important as reading the words. Please make sure this is recorded in their reading record as for every 50 reads your child will get a prize. We encourage wider reading too, e.g. comics, newspapers, non-fiction, recipes and books from home.
