

## 10 important things to know

- 1. The Great Fire of London of 1666 happened in the Stuart period.
- 2. It started in a bakery in Pudding Lane.
- 3. It lasted for 5 days.
- 4. The fire spread quickly because:
  - houses were made of wood and close together.
  - it was very hot. There was no rain.
  - there was no trained fire brigade.
- 5. Many houses were burned, and we think 6 people died.
- 6. Samuel Pepys' and John Evelyn's diaries tell us about the fire.
- 7. The Monument is a memorial to remind us what happened.
- 8. Sir Christopher Wren planned the rebuilding of London.
- 9. Houses were rebuilt further apart from each other. More were built from brick and stone.
- 10. Fire brigades were set up to stop this from happening again.
